

Field Services

During the Safer at Home Order

Employees and Work Spaces

- Adhere to social distancing requirements:
 - Six feet between employees and customers when not performing a direct service
 - Meetings, showings, appraisals, gatherings limited to less than 10 people in any field setting
- Maintain detailed log of customer interactions: name, date, location, phone/email contact, details of services performed
- Tools/equipment must be sanitized after each customer interaction
- For in-person interactions within third-party homes:
 - Provide/require gloves and face covering for employees
 - Maintain detail log of customer interactions
 - Inquire with individuals in third-party homes about symptoms or contact with known positive cases. Provide guidance on good personal hygiene and frequent hand-washing, etc.

Customers

- Encourage contactless options like electronic invoices, receipts and payments
- Maintain six feet of separation for in-person interactions and wear face coverings
- Transportation requests (limo/taxi) should be for necessary travel only with hand-washing before and after
- Real estate: Individual showings only, no food or beverage can be provided

Field Services include but are not limited to:

- Landscaping and lawn care
- Housecleaning and handyman services
- Carpet cleaning and window cleaning
- Electricians and plumbers
- Architects/engineers
- Private investigators
- General contractors, tile setters, carpenters, construction
 - Home inspectors, appraisers
 - Land survey
- Transportation network companies
 - Limo and taxi (call and demand)
- In-person real estate showings and marketing services
 - Must adhere to physical distancing requirements with cleaning and disinfection of all high touch surfaces between each showing
